- Adherence to global regulations and standards ensures compliance with medical device regulations.

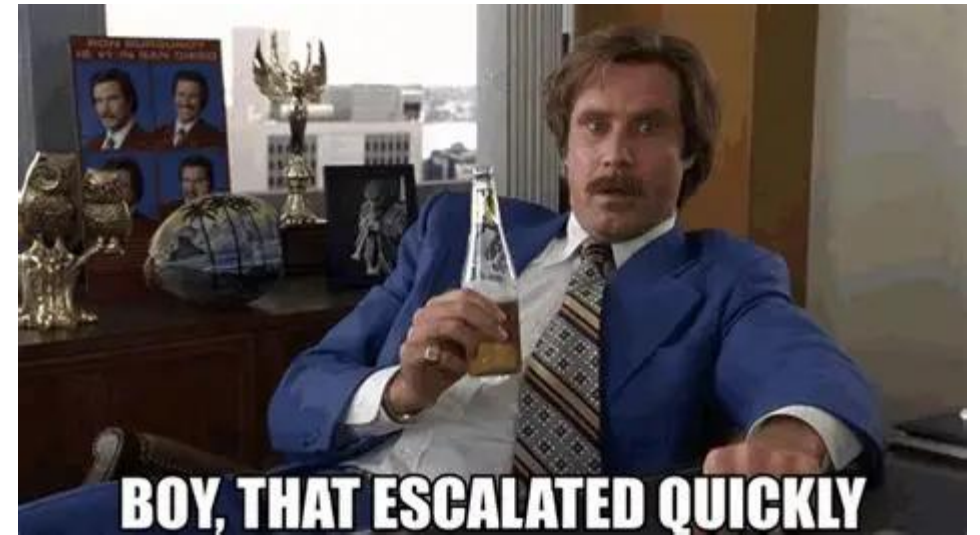
2 Quality-driven Processes
